Discussions:

We discussed issues related to a transfer of material from LETSI to the IEEE LTSC.
Discussed topics included?

The IEEE LTSC produces accredited standards. What are the strategic and market reasons that motivate the creation of accredited standards? Do those conditions exist for creating IEEE standards from LETSI material, or is it premature? In other words, is anyone waiting for IEEE standards to be developed.

LETSI and IEEE LTSC actions need to be geared towards promoting increased levels of adoption. How will we support that goal?

Perhaps accredited standards matter more to government adopters than to industry. How important is government adoption for our products?

Perhaps standards should be considered as a phase in a product development lifecycle. We should apply a product development framework to the problem.

Is it appropriate to think about developing standards in the absence of a roadmap or architecture: a sense of where we are collectively going and how the pieces fit together.

We discussed the idea of a phased model in which each phase assumes increased resources, maturity and adoption, and at a certain point there is a hand-off to the IEEE LTSC if resources are available and there is justification to proceed.

We discussed LETSI adopting IEEE LTSC document templates so that LETSI could produce a document that was isomorphic to an IEEE standard which could be directly transitioned to the IEEE LTSC if appropriate or used independently if standardization was not pursued.
